Parent/Student 1:1 Device Agreement

Terms and Conditions:

This 1:1 device is being issued to you during your current enrollment in Macon County Schools. This device and managed applications will remain the property of Macon County Schools. Your right to possession and use is limited to, and conditioned upon your full and complete compliance with the Acceptable Use Policy #630 (posted on the MCS website) and the terms and conditions presented in this agreement.

Care and protection of this device is your responsibility. Students should not allow any other student or family member to have access or use of the device at any time. iPads should never be used without the protective case that has been provided, and the case should never be removed or replaced. Laptops should always be transported in a protective bag or case.

Any damage to the device should be reported as soon as possible to your teacher and Media Coordinator or your school Tech Facilitator. Macon County Schools will be responsible for assessing any damages to the device. Any damage that is deemed neglect or deliberate will be dealt with accordingly and may result in incurring obligations, loss of use and/or disciplinary action.

In the event of loss or theft of the device on school grounds, students must report the occurrence to the Principal's office that day. The school will then be responsible for filing a police report if the device is lost or stolen on school property.

In the event of loss or theft of the device outside of school grounds, parents must file a police report as soon as possible. The parent or student must report the occurrence to the Principal's office by the next school day. Parents will also need to provide the school with a police report of the incident.

Students must bring their school issued device to class every day. Students should also bring their power charger and cable. All devices should be charged every night so that they are ready to use in class. Student should only use chargers that have been provided by Macon County Schools.

This device is being provided for educational purposes. Students should not download inappropriate content, applications, songs, movies, games, etc. Students should read, understand and follow the Macon County Schools Acceptable Use Policy #630. Students should not change iTunes



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account information or log on to the iPad with their personal iTunes account. Students should not delete applications or content that has been provided as part of the course curriculum.

Macon County Schools must comply with all federal CIPA regulations with regards to student email. These regulations require that all student email be filtered for inappropriate content. Students are provided with a school approved, CIPA compliant email address. Students should use only the school provided email account with the device and with any communication to any faculty member or student. Students should not add personal email accounts to the device.

Macon County Schools must comply with all federal CIPA regulations with regards to Internet access. All Internet access on the device will be filtered for inappropriate content, both at school and away from school campus. Any attempt at bypassing or disabling the filter will be logged and will result in disciplinary action.

Macon County School's faculty and staff have the authority to monitor usage and will periodically monitor applications and content to ensure appropriate use and compliance with this agreement and Macon County Schools Acceptable Use Policy.
